#### Local History Group b)

The Landscape History Group invited Mrs. Jone Doherty of Hampshire County Council Planning Department and author of its booklet on "Ancient Lanes and Trackways" to its Thursday evening spot. Eventually the Society will be contributing to HCC's survey. Yateley is rich in ancient rights of way, from the paths tradden by mediaeval villagers on their way to the common fields between Manor Park and Cricket Hill; to the old cart roads such as Lomer's Lone, part of which was recently surveyed by the group; to the ancient Welsh Drive crossing Blackbushe Airport and which Mr. Arnold has now seemingly obstructed with his new hangar; to the A.30 itself with its long history from ancient trackway to Turnpike to trunk road. Has the A.30 always been in its present course? The old Anglo-Saxon boundary charters suggest the old route was some distance south of the current highway, and contiguous with the old parish boundary. The group therefore spent a recent Sunday afternoon walking the old parish boundary starting behind the Gibralter Barracks. The old boundary dyke was clearly discernible and the "believers" are convinced they found the road, mediaeval, Anglo-Saxon or even Roman? Who knows? Now is the time for more documentary research.

#### 5th September 1981 - Trip to The Weald & Downland Open Air Museum at Singleton

Rather disappointingly, only four turned up for this outing. We "all" arrived at ll a.m. on a beautiful late summer day, and toured not laly the familiar exhibits but also the considerable number of new ones which have appeared in the last year or so. For the uninitiated, it consists of a large area of lovely Sussex downland, between Midhurst and Chichester, on which buildings of many types and periods have been re-erected in their original form.

In addition to buildings going back to Saxon times there are also exhibitions and working demonstrations. A working watermill can be seen, and flour ground on site purchased, and many other crafts and working methods were on show.

## FANCY THAT .... 6.

#### Thunder Storm 1797

"In a tremendous storm of thunder and lightning on Sunday, July 16th 1797, the poor house at Yateley was struck by lightning; the roof was entirely term off and devolished, the window-frames were driven in and s livered to pieces, two doors were knocked down and rent to splinters, and part of the brickwork on one side of the house forcibly burst into the yard. Four women were sitting round a table, and a child in the arms of one of them, was struck down, and remained insensible for near an hour;

and a young woman, standing in the same room at a small distance, had her cap forced off, and her hair much singed, but providentially neither of their received any material injury. The bed of a poor man, an inhabitant of the same promises, who, that vening happened to be detained by the temp st at Blackwater, was forcibly thrown through the chasm of the wall into the yard, and the bedstead was broken to atoms."

Derok Dob rty has copied out all the Yateley references in the unpublished early nineteenth century manuscript Bingley's History of Hampshire. The above cytract is quoted by Bingley from the Gentleman's Magazine, September 1797. Who were the unfortunates involved in this dramatic incident? The Ov. rs. rs Accounts, available on microfilm, may provide the answers and further leads. Anyone interested in taking up the story? ........
