Parish Plans Underway!

Yateley Parish Plan will provide the policy framework for the future of Yateley, and how it develops. The Yateley Society has been given responsibility for the land-use planning. A key part of the plan, this will identify "character areas" for each part of Yateley, to provide a framework for deciding what development is appropriate, in what locations.

Yateley Town Council has set ub a comprehensive website which can take input from anyone willing to contribute. The address is www.yateleyparishplan.pkwiki.com.

The following is an extract from the "How can you (and your neighbours) take part?" page:

"Parish Plans are all about everyone getting involved. In very small communities that statement might literally be true. In a Civil Parish the size of Yateley, everyone cannot sit on committees, and decide the actual words written in the Plan. However everyone can voice their opinions and everyone can be consulted. For previous plans consultation has either been accomplished by the Yateley Town Council sending out questionnaires to every household in Yateley, or, for Town Centre Plans and other policies incorporated into draft Hart District Local Plans, public consultation was carried out by means of objection letters and a Local Plan Inquiry.

The new planning process now means that we, the general public of Yateley, are in the driving seat. You can say how you want to be consulted: questionnaire, local meeting, exhibition? You tell us. That is one good reason why we set up this special website. That's fine for people with internet connections. So if you know of neighbours without computers, ask them what they think about the issues you are most concerned about, and you let us know what they think. Let's get a big discussion going. Send us letters. Write to the local newspapers! How can we make Yateley better? Email Yateley Town Council on office@yateley-tc.gov.uk

Of course the best way to have your say is to join one of the many groups needed to produce the Parish Plan. There are Topic Groups and Area Groups based on specific locations, mainly based on Yateley's 4 Wards. You will be welcomed to join any of the following:

Character Assessment Teams based on the 4 Yateley Wards looking at spatial planning

Yateley Family History Corner - Smythe

The Yateley Society gets a steady stream of enquiries from family historians about their Yateley ancestors. They are always interesting, though obviously some are more interesting than others. From about 1910 to 1960 Yateley had many notable people.

The latest find is Wing-Commander Cyril R Smythe (1899-1984), who after his retirement from the RAF lived at Melford Cottage, Chandlers Lane from April 1947 until 1952, when he moved to Devon to take up farming. He was a WW1 "flying ace" who shot down 6 German aircraft. His "observer" was awarded a DFC for his part in shooting down two of these aircraft in the space of a few minutes whilst under heavy enemy attack. In 1921 a plane Cyril was flying crash landed in Afganistan, and

he and his colleague were only saved from being murdered by tribesmen by the intervention of a mullah. During WW2 he presided over 500 courts martial.

In Yateley he served on the council, became a magistrate and Secretary of Yateley Conservative Association. His son Colin, who contacted us having found the Yateley Society website, was a child when his parents were in Yateley. Colin is a specialist publisher, who received an Honorary Doctor of Laws from Trinity College Dublin for promoting Irish literature, but he is more famous for being Terry Pratchett's original publisher and literary agent.

Does anyone know anything more about Cyril Smythe's time in Yateley?
