A plea for help from London.

You may have seen in the media that a planning application has been made to replace several listed buildings in the vicinity of The Bank, Mansion House, etc, by a new office block. English Heritage have asked as many Civic Society members as possible to write and oppose this application on the grounds:-

(a) that the demolition of the existing buildings is totally unacceptable,

(b) that the proposed new building is the wrong building in the wrong place,

(c) that there is no reason why the existing buildings cannot be imaginatively refurbished to suit modern needs as the scheme devised for SAVE has shown.
