

Patrick Crowley, Chairman of the Wokingham and Bracknell RSPB Members Group will give an illustrated talk on Heathland Birds. He has spent the last 3 years looking at areas of local heathland, and learning about the birds that can be seen on both the heathland and in adjacent habitats.
