

'Old Camberley' - a Video made from Early 20th Century Films

Roger Coombes will present a video depicting aspects of life in Camberley in the late 1930's.

This video was assembled by the late John King from cine films which he took while at Grammar School in Camberley. It shows a variety of celebrations, visits by notables and other special events and includes a commentary. The source of the commentary is Ken Clark, who has published books of Camberley postcards.

This is the first of a series of three videos by Mr King, and if it proves suitably engrossing the others will be shown later.

The September showing is intended to encourage interest in the history of one of the more important places near Yateley, which inevitably has had an influence on the development of Yateley and the surrounding area. It will, we hope, form an 'appetiser' for a talk to be given in January 1999 by Phil Stevens, who will tell us the story of 'Medieval Surrey Heath'.

FOX FARM III: IS THE END IN SIGHT?

The third planning appeal by British Car Auctions for permission to build 42 houses at Fox Farm, off Monteagle Lane, Yateley reopened on 3 September after two years. First surprise was a new Inspector, unknown even to Hart DC until that morning (apparently due to a clerical slip-up by the Government Office for the South East); second surprise but one we have come to expect for these BCA inquiries - though programmed for only two days, the inquiry is continuing for a further three days: Tuesday/Wednesday 8/9 September and Tuesday 15 September.

The Council Chamber of Hart District Council in Fleet is the arena for this renewed confrontation and the District Council is supported by Catherine Chatters of English Nature; Dave Burges of RSPB; the solicitor for Hampshire County Council who is calling Jeff Edwards, the County's Principal Ecologist, and Tony Davis, the Sites Manager for NE Hampshire - more familiarly known to us as the warden-in-chief of Yateley Common; Yateley Town Council, represented by Edward Dawson and Lawrence Smith; and finally, but we hope not least, the Yateley Society represented by Peter Tipton, with our expert witness, the entomologist Mike Edwards, who surveyed the insects on the commonland lying between Little Vigo and Castle Bottom for a key part of our evidence to the Inquiry in 1996.

All the indications are that this case has become a test case in the understanding of the rigours of the new environmental legislation which seeks to protect species and habitats throughout the European Community. The arguments are not easy to follow because the debate is exploring reams and reams of written argument which has been submitted by both sides to the Inspector beforehand. But we do need bottoms on seats for this one. Public interest *is* judged by numbers of people who turn up. This has been a difficult and tricky inquiry to prepare for, both for the Society's planning team and for Hart's solicitor, Nicolette Pike, and for Catherine Chatters and Dave Burges. The RSPB alone has spent £25,000 and English Nature may well have spent much more than that. Please try to come, even for half and hour; and please sign the attendance sheet as a Society member. Start time is 11.30am on 8 September, and 10.00am on 9 and 15 September with lunch break usually between 1.00pm and 2.00pm. If in doubt, phone 873378 the evening before you intend to come.
