Mushroom Farm - Hampshire County Council have insisted that, if planning permission is granted, another £800,00 must be spent on a roundabout at Handford Lane/Cricket Hill, traffic lights at the A30/Reading Road junction and footpaths on Sandhurst Road and Darby Green Lane to link the site with Sandhurst station. The Planning Inspectorate requested comments on these demands and the impact of the new PPG13 from various sources, including the Yateley Society and there have been further exchanges of evidence as a result. Land adjacent to Pond Farm - after yet another set of revised plans, this time for

8 houses, being refused planning permission, yet another appeal is being made by the Developers! In the meantime, the whole area remains derelict.

The White Lion - It became apparent that the Developers were overstepping the Listed Building planning perameters when, among other things, significant internal doors and architraves were removed and this became front page news in the Yateley News. The Society brought this

to the attention of Hart DC and work was suspended. However it appears likely that Hart DC will allow alterations which go beyond what was permitted by the Listed Building Consent. Will this be yet another example of Hart DC's unsatisfactory attitude to the law concerning Conservation Areas and Listed Buildings? (See Events Programme for June 21st) Blackbushe Metals - Permission is being sought to base 11 HGVs at this site with a further 16 at Hawkers Lodge. The Society continues to urge Hampshire County Council to resolve the issues concerning the usage of the site.

Land between Sandhurst Road/Reading Road and the Blackwater River -Permission is being sought for an extension to a planning permission granted in 1993. The Society will continue to object to unacceptable proposals/modifications put forward for this Site of Importance for Nature Conservation (SINC) and the recent adoption of the new PPG13 also

backs up the unsuitability of the site for

the development in transport terms.

Castle Bottom - a proposal is in place for rare breed cattle to graze the land at Castle Bottom - which would help with keeping this area under control. However, if MAFF are successful in banning special permission footpath closures (claiming foot and moth is no longer a problem), the owner of the cattle may rethink. Let's hope for the best!


July - Hoping to persuade Elizabeth Tipton to lead a Local Heritage walk September 20 - Hampshire Wildlife Trust
