#### ..and these issues are currently in discussion by the Executive Committee:

The Committee is arranging a meeting with the newly appointed officer in charge of
Development Control, the department which deals with planning issues, to discuss our
concerns regarding the recent, apparent lack of consideration towards Conservation
Areas and Listed Buildings.

#### Local Planning -

- · Barclay House development was refused comprehensively by Councillors
- . The new Nemaste development for Chandlers Lane was also refused
- Mushroom Farm Although the High Court judicial review hearing is scheduled for January 2002, the Developers have asked the Council to arrange an all day Public Consultation meeting on January 12<sup>th</sup> 2002 for a "hands-on planning exercise".
- A robust letter in response to the official public consultation document, Darby Green
  Conservation Area Statement, has been sent. The document included no character
  assessment or policies (which was unacceptable since the Local Plan had not included any,
  on the basis that they should be in the Conservation Area Statement!
- Blackbushe Metals Operator Licence is held up awaiting an Environmental Impact Assessment on the Site of Specific Scientific Interest.
- The inquest following the Air Crash at Blackbushe Business Park in December 2000 has been reported in the Press, but there seem to be no recommendations apparent to avoid a repetition of this tragedy.

#### History -

 St Peters Churchyard Memorials - Richard Johnston and Tony Hocking joined the church workparty of November 17<sup>th</sup> and gravestones were removed from the rubbish tip and laid out nearby. These stones have now been recorded. There are still some missing memorials, which may have been used as hardcore.
