#### Yateley Village Design Framework:

Members of the Yateley Society did a walk on 23rd May and took over 300 photographs of various aspects of Yateley from Cricket Hill roundabout to Hall Lane roundabout in readiness for the next stage of the project. #### Town Planning:

Whilst the argument continues in London about the rights and wrongs of the Inspectors decision for the original development plan for the Blue Prince Mushroom Farm, a new application has been lodged by Linden Homes. This new plan is for a little over 13,000 sq m of offices (compared with 16,000 on the revised plans) and still with over 400 car parking spaces!

The next Development Control meeting at Hart is expected to consider the applications for housing at Sandhurst Road and the replacement of Yateley Cottage, Eversley with 5 new houses.
