Town and Country Planning Process to involve more Members!

This was the main business of the last Executive Committee meeting. This process will be changed, creating a Registrar who receives and logs the planning correspondence, then alerts one of a team of Area Monitors to conduct a preliminary assessment of applications that need action, ie go and have a look to see what impact the proposals will have.

The Planning Subcommittee has standing rules to filter the type of applications to be considered. If it is considered that the Society should send a letter then the Area Monitor will produce a first draft and e-mail it to the team for comment, improvement and approval. The new arrangements will obviously further strengthen the Society's planning activity, spreading experience and expertise within the team.

The main risk areas are Clarks Farm (where Head of Environmental Services at Hart District Council has recently asked for the Society's thoughts about what should happen at the site), Fox Farm, The Flats at Blackwater (where there is an accumulation of proposals for single buildings being redeveloped as multiple buildings), Land by Sandhurst Road (where a time extension to planning permission for a business park is requested), the Urnfield site and Yateley Green, Cricket Hill, Darby Green and the SIMS Metals area.
