

WW2 PROJECT

Last month we held two oral history 'Drop-In Days' at Yateley Library on 8th and 22nd May, supported by the Library Lecture "Lest We Forget" on Thursday 20th. They were a resounding success!



We had one gentleman who had driven over from Essex to the Library Lecture on Thursday 20th, and had stayed on so he could attend the Saturday session. He was the son of the wartime headmaster and brought artefacts and photographs for us to make digital copies on the spot using our professional standard equipment.

We even had a lady now living in Australia who had recognised an old school friend in a promotion we had published in the local paper. She was by chance visiting relations in Hartley Wintney. Three generations of one very interesting Yateley family turned up bringing photographs, one of a VE-Day party which previous correspondents told us never took place!

A whole family had driven over from Aylesbury, we had a couple from Gillingham, Dorset, and another family from Swindon.





Our interviewers were largely utilised at full capacity. We even had to reassign one of our 'greeters' as a 'registrar'. We used a series of prepared forms to find out which subjects our visitors could tell us about so that we can prepare interview questions to be used for future taped oral history recordings with some of them.



The excellent attendance at the events was largely due to Muriel Brent, a local lady well known in prewar Yateley, who wrote letters to all her schoolfriends and we were fortunate to have two articles published in local papers. both of which published this large colour photograph of Peter and Muriel, standing by our 'Yateley in World War 2' exhibition.

The Yateley Society is now offering a prize to local school children to produce a wartime 'rural pie' in their cookery class. These Rural Pies were cooked in rural homes and village bakeries and distributed in Yateley by the Ministry of Food via Yateley Vicarage. 450 were sold per week in a village with a population of 2,100. The pupils will use the Library for research.

The Coach House, Macrae Road - An application has been received to split the former Bed and Breakfast premises into 4 flats, leaving the former stable block as one dwelling and erect a new block with 4 houses and 4 flats. This is a large development in a critical part of the Conservation Area. The Society urges all members to voice their comments about this application.

Comments can be made online by selecting the "Also make comments on current applications" option and scrolling down to the bottom of the page to the "Comment on Application" link.

Manor Corner (1 Mill Lane) - Peter Tipton attended the site visit with the Planning Inspector and the decision, just heard, is that the appeal has been rejected!

Clarks Farm - Hart District Council have approved their new policy for the Local Plan 1996 - 2006 which allocates Clarks Farm as "suitable for redevelopment for 2,500 sq m of employment floor space in a landscaped setting, subject to the removal of the existing uses......" together with some additional criteria"

Green Slopes, Cricket Hill Lane - This is for a 5 bedroom house which will fill the gap next to Hylands. This has previously been refused by an Appeal Inspector. The Society has sent a letter of objection.

Forty Winks - A 3rd garage to link the existing double garage with the house is requested. An objection will be made.

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Castle Bottom - It seems that the bog myrtle at Castle Bottom is thriving, perhaps responding to improvement in the water.

Goodbye - We are sorry to hear of the departure of Yateley Ranger, Clare Bloomer who has been a good friend to the Society, and we would like to thank her for all her help.

Blackbushe Air Crash - An AAIB report on the accident last September has been received. The cause of the crash was undercarriage failure due to poor maintenance. There were no injuries, but the aircraft was badly damaged. We await the report on the Raytheon Premier 1 which overran the runway and was destroyed on April 7.

RMC - the planning permission obtained on appeal, has been abandoned by RMC - seemingly due to the conditions placed upon it.

Still outstanding is the issue of whether the independent Sales and Servicing operation should be classed as B2 status. Anne Davies, on behalf of the Society is pursuing the matter with Hart District Council.

Conservation Working Party - The session held on the last Sunday of April was devoted to clearance from the Cemetery to the land bank.
